

The Foundation aims to achieve this by working with local Scottish Masonic Lodges and charitable/not-for-profit organisations that demonstrate commitment to those in need within our State.

The Foundation also provides broader based community support utilizing the resources and skills of our brethren to facilitate and support initiatives with significant benefit to the WA community.

Our Vision

Improving the quality of life of all Western Australians through a more highly visible community practice of the principles and values of Scottish Freemasonry.

Our Values

Our decisions and actions are guided by our values which are:

Brotherly Love: Every true Freemason will show tolerance and respect for the opinions of others and behave with kindness and understanding to his fellow creatures.

Relief: Freemasons are taught to practice charity and to care, not only for their own, but also for the community as a whole both by charitable giving, and by voluntary efforts and works as individuals.

Truth: Freemasons strive for truth, requiring high moral standards and aiming to achieve them in their own lives.

CHAIRMAN REPORT

As I write this report the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA Inc is in a strong financial position. This position is attributed to the continued hard work of the Board of Directors.

During 2022 - 2023 the Foundation has been able to maintain its commitment to providing support to the community:

This year we supported the following:

\$15,000 to the RSLWA. This was to support their Christmas Hampers for Veterans (Hampers for Vets) project. This grant funded 300 Christmas hampers.

\$20,000 to MNDAWA. The funds supported the employment of a Respiratory Nurse to create treatment plans for those MND patients at FSH, SCGH and SJOG Midland.

\$10,000 to the Lions Cancer Institute. These funds were used to help fund the mobile Cancer Screening coach.

\$30,000 to SLSWA. This is an ongoing grant for their TOAD and Rise Up Camps, continued support of the statewide Youth Program & Pathways, the Youth Leaders Program and also the SLSWA Nipper and Youth Awards.

\$5,000 to the Perth Metro Pipe Band. The Foundation has supported the band for many years and they perform at the Annual Gala Ball and the Charity Golf Day.

\$850 to Freemasons WA Annual Charity Golf Day. As well as being a Silver Sponsor the Foundation has a team of four playing in the event.

As part of our Grant program the Board has made available \$1,000 per Lodge to be granted to a charity of their choice. This money is used to match the donation that the Lodge is making. Over the past year the following Lodges have taken advantage of this:

Lodge Sir Walter Scott-Breadalbane supported Andrew Anderson and Movember with a donation of \$700. This donation was matched by the Foundation.

Lodge Menzies Doric donated \$1,800 to the Rockingham Man's Shed and the Foundation also donated \$1,000 making the total \$2,800.

We are pleased that some of the Lodges have taken the opportunity to become more involved with the Foundation in their local community and it would be great to see more Lodges connect with their community.

I would like to express my thanks to all the Scottish Lodges in this District for their continuing support of the Foundation.

During the year I attended several events, which has been good considering the past few years.

On Monday 17th October 2022 the SMCFWA Annual Charity Golf Day was held at Wanneroo Golf Club, and it was nice to welcome back our Sponsors and the 48 players who played had a fantastic day. Thank you to those who attended. The 2023 event will be held on Monday 9th October at Wanneroo Golf Club for the last time.

On Wednesday 21st December 2022, In the morning, I went to the offices of MNDAWA to present the cheque for \$20,000 which would allow them to continue their work for the benefit of those affected. Afterwards, I then went to the headquarters of RSLWA on St. Georges Terrace and met the new CEO who accepted our cheque for \$15,000 for the Christmas hampers for the Ex-Service Personnel who may be doing it tough.

On Wednesday 4th January 2023, Andrew Bruce and I were at the SLSWA Rise Up Camp at Hillary's to present their Grant cheque of \$30,000. We watched the participants partake in set tasks and had a lovely dinner with them.

On the 7th of February 2023, Ron Kirkwood and I met with the Lions Cancer Institute in Mandurah to present their Grant cheque of \$10,000.

On Saturday 29th April 2023, Peta McLean, Alan MacKenzie, and I attended the SLSWA Nipper and Youth Awards Ceremony where Alan and I presented some of the awards.

On Monday 8th May 2023, Lindsay Mitchell and I along with 2 of our Charity Golf Day Hole Sponsors, attended the Freemasons WA Charity Golf Day at Wanneroo Golf Club (which the Foundation is a Silver Sponsor of) and again we had a wonderful time although not in the placings this year.

On Friday 26th May 2023, Peta and I attended the Coastal Bravery Awards Ceremony on behalf of the Foundation, a lovely Ceremony which can be quite emotional.

On Saturday 1st July 2023, at the Crown Grand Ballroom, June, Peta, William and I attended the SLSWA Awards Ceremony, and I again had the honour to present two of the Awards, one for Young Surf Life Saver of the Year and one for Young Volunteer of the Year.

SMCFWA GRANTS 2022 - 2023

The Foundation, through the returns on its investments, has been able to maintain the same level of Grants during 2022 - 2023 as in previous years.

During this time, we granted funds to Surf Life Saving WA, RSLWA, Motor Neurone Disease Association of Western Australia, GL Scotland Prostate Make it a £1 Million, Lions Cancer Institute and Perth Metro Pipe Band.

We organised another year of DGLWA, SMCFWA (Scottish Masonic Homes) and Archives Storage. We also sponsored a hole and sent a team to the Freemasons WA Golf Day. This team consisted of Board members, George Rogers and Lindsay Mitchell and two of our own Golf Day Sponsors, Paul Reid and Craig Wilson.

GL Scotland Prostate Make it a £1 Million

In July 2022 Grand Master Mason, William Ramsay McGhee and Grand Secretary William M S Semple attended the installation of the DGM of DGLWA, Bro Clive Lynn. While here they attended a morning tea held at the Foundation. During this morning tea the Chairman, George Rogers and DGM of WA Bro Clive Lynn presented a cheque for \$23,000 to Grand Secretary William M S Semple towards this cause. This cheque was made up of a donation of \$11,000 from the DGLWA and Scottish Lodges and \$12,000 from the Foundation.





RSLWA

This year again saw the Foundation support the RSLWA in their Christmas Hampers for Veterans (Hamper for Vets) project by providing a grant of \$15,000. These hampers are handed out to around 300 Veterans and their families during December in time for Christmas.

Motor Neurone Disease Association of WA (MNDAWA)

The Foundation provide further funding to MNDAWA for their Physio in their Breath a Little Easier program. We approved \$20,000 for use in this program for the second year.

George Rogers presented the cheque to their Chief Executive Officer, Courtney D'Mello.







The Foundation also received a Certificate of Recognition for their donation in 2021 - 2022.

Lions Cancer Institute

In October 2022, the Lions Cancer Institute approached the Foundation to see if we would provide another grant of \$10,000 towards the Mobile Cancer Screening Coach. As this cause is close to many people's hearts, the Board was happy to provide the Grant.

George Rogers, Ron Kirkwood and two representatives from the Lions Cancer Institute, Neil Saunders and Gary Irvine, met up in March 2023 for the cheque presentation.





The Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA (Inc) plays a significant role in developing young lifesavers within Western Australia through their support of Surf Life Saving WA (SLSWA).

Over the 2022/23 season, funding provided by the Foundation has assisted SLSWA in four key areas, namely:

- 1. Continued support of the statewide Youth Program & Pathways
- 2. Continued support of the Youth Leaders Program (YLP)
- 3. Continued support and further enhancement of the popular Youth Development Camps Rise Up and T.O.A.D.
- 4. Continued support as presenting rights partner of the SLSWA Nipper and Youth Awards

Youth Program & Pathways

SLSWA's Youth Program encompasses members aged U14 through to U17 and includes the Youth Leaders' Program and the Youth Program Pathways.

The ultimate aim of the Youth Program is to engage, enthuse and educate all graduating 'Nippers' and new youth members, regardless of ability in the surf sport discipline, and aid the retention and development of members.

The program provides learning experiences across four main areas, namely lifesaving, training, leadership and surf sports.

SLSWA offers statewide Youth Pathway Courses, empowering its youth members to actively engage in the various areas of Surf Life Saving. These courses include the Youth Age Manager, Youth Coach, Youth Event Producer, Youth Trainer and Youth Official.

Youth Leaders Program

Within the broader Youth Program Curriculum is the opt in Youth Leaders Program (YLP). Available to all youth members, the optional Youth Leaders Program tracks the hours a youth member puts into lifesaving, training and surf sports.

There are three recognition levels to the program; Bronze, Silver and Gold, which are increasingly difficult to obtain. To achieve Gold Level, members have accumulated in excess of 230 volunteer hours during their period as a Surf Life Saving youth member (13-16-year-olds).

The certificates achieved at each level of the YLP carry the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA's logo.

This past year, an impressive 28 youth members achieved Gold level status in the YLP. These members were recognised at the 2023 Nipper & Youth Awards presented by the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA, which took place Saturday, 29 April 2023.

Nipper & Youth Awards, presented by the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA

With the impact of COVID-19, the 2022 Nippers & Youth Awards event was postponed to Saturday 8th October 2022.

Close to 300 guests came together to recognise and celebrate the achievements across a range of areas, including lifesaving, surf sports competition and volunteering. Categories awarded included the U15 Lifesaver of the Year, Surf Sports Nipper Champion, U14/U15 Athlete, Youth Official, Nipper and Youth of the Year.

Thirty-four outstanding individuals were also recognised for their attainment of Gold Level in Surf Life Saving WA's Youth Leaders Program, which required them to have accumulated more than 230 volunteer hours during their period as a youth member, requiring significant commitment and dedication across multiple seasons.

Over 300 guests gathered for the 2023 Nipper & Youth Awards on Saturday 29 April, as more than 100 outstanding young members from across WA were recognised for their achievements across a range of areas, including surf sports, lifesaving, competition and volunteering.

Twenty-eight outstanding individuals from a number of clubs were recognised for their attainment of Gold Level in Surf Life Saving WA's Youth Leaders Program, which required them to have accumulated more than 230 volunteer hours during their period as a youth member, requiring significant commitment and dedication across multiple seasons.



2023 Surf Life Saving WA Awards of Excellence Saturday, 1st July 2023

The Surf Life Saving WA Awards of Excellence recognise the achievements and contributions of members and clubs across a range of categories and areas of Surf Life Saving, including the key areas of surf sports, education and training, youth and lifesaving. This year, 460 people came together at Grand Ballroom on Saturday, 1st July to celebrate the 2022/23 season.

George Rogers from the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA presented two awards on the evening – Youth Surf Lifesaver of the Year and Young Volunteer of the Year.





Youth Development Camps – Rise Up and T.O.A.D.

Each year, SLSWA runs two development camps for youth members. These sold-out camps provide opportunities for teamwork and leadership skills to be developed by those attending. Rise Up camp ran from Monday, 19 December through to Thursday 22 December 2022, while T.O.A.D camp ran from Tuesday, 3 January through to Friday, 6 January 2023.

Rise Up Camp

In the week leading up to Christmas, fifty-five U17 members from 23 clubs made their way to Forest Edge Recreation Camp, Waroona, for Rise Up Camp.

The happy campers spent four days completing various challenging (and often hilarious) activities, including constructing rafts which they then needed to successfully paddle (while staying relatively afloat) across a stretch of water.

Teamwork and trust were developed during abseiling, kayaking and billy cart building and many relays, including the wheelbarrow race, which saw their competitive sides emerge. Participants also built on their first aid skills in preparation for certificates such as Advanced Resuscitation Techniques.

Fantastic friendships were formed with SLSWA youth members from around the state, and another successful year of Rise Up was had.







T.O.A.D. (Teamwork, Opportunity and Development) Camp

In early January 2023, seventy-two U14 & U15 members from 28 clubs ventured to Ern Halliday Recreation Camp for the TOAD (Teamwork, Opportunities and Development) Camp. Despite the extreme heat, it was a fantastic four days for the toadies, with many new friends made and extra beach sessions added to the mix!

Participants enjoyed working together on various activities, including archery, the bigswing and crate climb and mountain biking. Teams worked together to challenge themselves and their leadership skills through crate climbs, steadied their hands during archery, tested their biking skills on the pump track and took on the giant swing, all with great success.

As well as fun activities, every happy camper also completed their Radio Operators Certificate.

Once again, it was wonderful to have representatives from the SMCFWA, join our Toadies on camp one afternoon where they presented the group with a cheque for \$30,000, representing their ongoing support for SLSWA and our youth members.

The assistance of the SMCFWA continues to help us deliver these camps and provide our regional youth with generous travel subsidies to enable them to attend. It also allows us to deliver a range of exciting and challenging activities, ensuring our youth members have a great camp experience.

We sincerely thank the Foundation for its continued support.









PERTH METRO PIPE BAND

The Perth Metro Pipe Band were once again delighted and humbled by the ongoing support of the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation (SMCF). The gratitude of the band cannot be understated. Running a pipe band requires significant funds. Uniforms, instruments and facility hire are not cheap. The Band requires annual player subscriptions to keep them afloat but in the current economic climate it is difficult to ask members to increase their subscriptions which is why the grants received from the SMCF are so invaluable and much appreciated by every playing member.

Sadly, for the Perth Metro Pipe Band the expected return of playing members and opportunities for public engagements in the 2022-2023 year hasn't met the band's post-COVID expectations. A small group of dedicated players bolstered by the return of Pipe Major James Cowie continue to regularly rehearse every Monday at the Bob Hawke College in Subiaco.

Whilst remaining optimistic about the steady growth, the band have been working hard to learn new music that will bolster their repertoire and enhance their competitive edge for the upcoming State Championship to be held at the Armadale Highland Games in October.

The band were able to recommence its annual Shindig in 2022. A fantastic night of music, food and dance to a sellout crowd. Like many organisations the Band has decided to defer its next Shindig to 2024 due to reduced band member availability and rising costs.

The Band were again honoured to be asked to play at both the Telethon Christmas Pageant and the ANZAC Day parade. These events allow all members of the band to get together to play as one to demonstrate our support of the work of Telethon and support for those who have served our nation.

SMCFWA & WA SCOTTISH LODGES GRANTS


As part of the Foundation's Grant program an amount of \$10,000 is set aside for use by the Scottish Lodges. This allows each Lodge to make a donation of up to \$1,000 and apply for the Foundation to match this during each financial year. During the past year only two Lodges took up this donation.

Lodge Sir Walter Scott-Breadalbane

This lodge approached us as their RWM, Andrew Anderson, participated in Movember. We have supplied this grant for three years. The request for \$700 was matched and a total of \$1,400 was donated to Movember.

Lodge Menzies Doric

This was approved by the Foundation and with the lodge's donation of \$1,800 a total of \$2,800 was donated. 
SMCFWA & WA SCOTTISH LODGES GRANTS

Camelot Rover Rotunda
